Initial HSE Notification of Fatality of a Tree Surgeon

On the 2nd December 2016 the HSE issued an initial Notification Number 2016/30. At this point in time the details are very limited but the notification states that an incident occurred on 23rd November 2016, where a self-employed tree surgeon, in the age range 35-44 years of age, was sadly killed following a fall from a tree in which he was working. The incident occurred in the North West of the UK.

The incident serves as a timely reminder of some key messages:

- 1. In tree work, falls from height are the cause of death and major injury.
- 2. Avoid climbing trees if safer means of access are available, such as mobile elevated work platforms.
- 3. All tree work involving work at height must be planned and carried out by a Competent Person who has appropriate training in all of the tasks required.
- 4. All equipment being used must be suitable for the task, and inspected prior to use.

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
